Independence

One of our aims in the Foundation Stage is to encourage the children to become independent learners. You can help your child towards this goal by encouraging them to manage their own dressing i.e. taking off/putting on and fastening their coats, dealing with their bag/lunchbox etc. Please be assured that help and support is always on hand by staff and no child is left to struggle or become distressed.








Topic

Everyone Welcom

The first couple of weeks is a 'getting to know you' time and settling in period. During this time children will be introduced to other teaching staff members and helped to familiarise themselves with their learning environment. A child who is worried and anxious won't feel ready to take in the new experiences of school, so therefore it is important that the staff get to know you and your child. In order to do this well the staff will observe all children for the first couple of weeks to determine their abilities, likes and dislikes. By carrying the assessments out over a few weeks, children will have the chance to settle in and remember skills that they might have forgotten over their time away from a setting! These observations and assessments will also help us to ensure that we are best meeting the needs of your child.

Our first topic will be all to do with families, with a focus on the story All about Families and a whole school text The Black Dog (focusing on overcoming fears and worries). Some of the activities the children will have the opportunity to explore will be drawing family portraits, sharing their adventure scrapbooks, reading many stories, such as, The Colour Monster, All Are Welcome, The Invisible String, building structures in the construction area, unpacking the role-play home corner amongst many other fun activities. We will also be concentrating on singing nursery rhymes and number songs too.

It would be great if you could share a different Nursery Rhyme with your child each night before bed.

Phonics



Nursery Parents

Nursery will be concentrating on the foundations of phonics Phase 1 within the phonics scheme. Phase One concentrates on developing children's speaking and listening skills and lays the foundations for the phonic work which starts in Phase 2. The emphasis during Phase 1 is to get children attuned to the sounds around them and ready to begin developing oral blending and segmenting skills. Phase 1 is divided into seven aspects. Each aspect contains three strands: Tuning in to sounds (auditory discrimination), Listening and remembering sounds (auditory memory and sequencing) and Talking about sounds (developing vocabulary and language comprehension).

More information will be sent out to you at a later date.

Reception Parents

Our school delivers *Little Wandle Letters and Sounds Revised* as our systematic, synthetic phonics (SSP) programme to teach early reading and spelling.

Your child will be sent home with a letter ring during the first half term for you to practise with. Please spend a few minutes each day going over the sounds with your child. **Any work that is done at home should be recorded in your child's Home/School Reading diary and signed by the parent or carer.** Your child's diary is checked weekly by the class teacher and it is paramount that parents check these daily for any notes sent home.

We will be holding a reading & phonics workshop during the Autumn term, a date will be finalised in the first week. If you cannot attend, we will be recording our power-point, so that you don't miss out and have the information to be able to support your child at home.

Mathematics

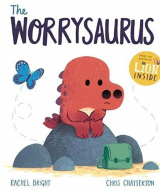
Activities within the first few weeks in Mathematics will involve sorting, matching, counting and shape/pattern work. Initially these will be largely practical and include the playing of number games, singing and acting out number songs and rhymes. The children will have a daily mathematics session, followed up with activities within the indoor and outdoor classrooms.

More information will be sent out regarding a Maths workshop.



Reading

All staff value the importance of sharing books with children. Sharing stories at home is vital, and we hope that you are able to spare 10mins at bedtime to share a story with your child. Allowing your child to choose the story, talk about the front cover/illustrations, the title, author, characters etc. School reading books will not be sent home until week 4 at the earliest.



This week's book recommendation is:

The Worrysaurus by Rachel Bright

This book I feel is very relevant to how children may be feeling when starting school with a little worry that can build up inside. It has a heartfelt message, which is delightfully conveyed. The illustrations are also fun and vibrant. A great read. The perfect book to help every anxious little dinosaur let go of their fears and feel happy in the moment.

PE

It is important that all children have the correct PE kit. Our PE kit policy states that only Navy or Black joggers/jumpers hoodies are acceptable. The Learning Book

Learning Book is a digital learning journey where you can observe, track and view information on a child's progress easily and securely.

Learning Book gives parents a smart, flexible way to review and interact with their child's early years education by transforming the link between home and the classroom. Increased visibility means parents can support the skills their son or daughter is learning at school or nursery by using the same teaching styles and processes at home when planning fun and educational activities.

Supporting your child's learning:

Do you know what your child did today at school or nursery? More importantly, do you know how that fits into their learning journey or what milestones they are currently working towards? Parents face enough time constraints as it is, and keeping up to date with your child's daily progress is not made any easier by limited contact time with their teachers. You need to be able to follow, review and understand what your son or daughter gets up to at school or nursery in order for you to give them the right support at home.

You should have received an email from Learning Book with a username and password for you to access your child's learning journey. If you have not, please contact Julie in the office.

USEFUL INFORMATION FOR NURSERY

- Reception School gates open at 8:45am – you need to enter the school via the main gate
- Nursery School gates open at 9:00am - you need to enter the school via the back entrance
- Pick up times
- Reception finish at 3:15pm
- Nursery finish at 3:30pm
- Please bear with us when we are dismissing the children in the first couple of days as we are getting used to all new faces.
- Please remember everything needs to be labelled
- Snacks - children in reception need to bring one snack in for the morning, this needs to be a healthy snack and remember we have a **NO NUTS** policy within our setting.
